PARKING DURING THE TURNAROUND

All You Need to Know — A Message from Main Security

At Shell Scotford there is designated parking.

Some parking stalls are assigned for a variety of reasons. For example, Handicapped, United Way, Step, and in some cases Position/Department specific etc. These are granted to individuals who qualify, have purchased, or earned the right to park in that spot and are not to be parked in at any time (even if vacant) if you are not the registered owner. Failure to comply will result in escalation of the Scotford Parking and Traffic Violation Policy.

The expectation is that all vehicles will be parked in the appropriate designated areas, registered with Security, displaying a valid parking pass, and not blocking emergency routes.

In the event of a parking violation, the policy states that the following will occur:

- On the first offense, there will be a written notice.
- On the second offense, there will be a written notice, and the individual's company representative, or manager will be notified.
- On the third offense, the individual's vehicle will be towed to a location in Fort Saskatchewan, at the owner's expense. Their company representative, or manager will be notified.


KNOW YOUR WASTES Bin Types for Each Waste Stream

Do you know your garbage? Waste management is fairly complex, so it is important to know how to classify and dispose of waste properly.

We segregate our wastes so it can be easily transferred to the appropriate landfill station. Mixing wastes makes for more work and can lead to dumpster fires. If you are unsure of any type of waste, or if it is too large to fit into the designated bin, please contact the waste team on TA14.

Always Be Cautious: When front load trucks or roll off trucks are picking up & setting down bins, do not walk close to or around the truck.

What is the Goal Zero Cup?

The Goal Zero Cup is awarded to a crew or group of workers each shift during the Turnaround.

How Do I Win the Cup?

- Nominations are sent to the STEP Facilitator.
- Crews are nominated based on exemplary, visible commitment to working safely.
 - ⇒ Safely completing work in challenging situations.
 - Mentoring and/or assisting others on safety.
 - Asking questions to ensure their safety or the safety of others.
 - Recognizing and working to fix unsafe conditions.
 - Assisting others who recognize unsafe conditions.

LESSONS LEARNED

A lesson learned is a thought or idea we want to capture in order to improve upon or sustain things we are presently doing. Nearly everything around you is a result of an idea that improved upon an earlier concept, or reinforced the recurring use of that concept.

Consider what things like PPE, vehicles, technology, and personal clothing were like 60 years ago, 30 years ago, and just 10 years ago. They are the way they are today because someone captured a thought or idea and then took an action to make things better.
