STEP Use Appropriate Walkways & Lights



We all want to get where we're going as quickly as possible and, because of this, we can be tempted to take the shortcut/walk through the ditch/jump over a barrier. DON'T!

Walking is our number one risk here at site and we need to do all we can to stay safe. When crossing the road, use the designated walkways and the lights that have been installed. They are there for your safety but only protect you if you use them!

A couple of extra steps and using the crosswalk lights could prevent a lot of pain!

5 EYE SAFETY FUNDAMENTALS

THE PILLARS OF EYE INJURY PREVENTION

Always ask "What If" before and while engaging in any job.



CREATE A SAFE WORKING ENVIRONMENT
Identify and control flying dust and debris. Ensure your tools are working properly and safety features are in place. Enclose, barricade or flag areas with unstable debris or dust. When working outdoors, remember that weather can be a factor.



EVALUATE AND MITIGATE EYE HAZARDS
Clean your area before you work and as you go. Don't forget to look up! Check the area above where you are working for any debris that may fall.



WEAR THE PROPER EYE AND FACE PROTECTION
Select and wear the appropriate CSA approved eye protection for the job and the hazard. Any gaps between your face and eyewear should be less than 2 millimetres.



DECONTAMINATE AND FOLLOW HYGIENIC PRACTICES
Before removing your eye protection, clean the top of your eye protection. Lean forward when removing your hard hat and glasses. Never store your gloves in your hard hat.



PLAN FOR AN INCIDENT
Identify the location of your nearest eye wash station and know how to use it. Report all injuries by notifying emergency services for assistance or attending the health centre for evaluation.

TRAFFIC CONTROL Around All Turnaround Areas

In order to provide safety for TA pedestrians and clear paths of travel for TA vehicles and machinery, please limit any unnecessary traffic around the units involved Turnaround ... especially traffic on F and G streets.
