AWARENESS IN THE WORKPLACE

STEP Safety *Clean as you Go*



Effective housekeeping can eliminate some workplace hazards and help get a job done safely and properly. Poor housekeeping can frequently contribute to accidents by hiding hazards that causing injuries.

- Keep floors, stairways, aisles, and other passageways clear of tools, equipment, trash, and other materials.
- Put tools away when they're not in use. Cover any sharp edges/use appropriate containers. Keep tools and materials away from edges when at heights.
- Stack materials carefully so they won't fall or block pathways.
- Clean up all spills immediately and properly, or call someone who can.
- Properly dispose of all trash.

The time taken to clean is nothing compared to the time/pain taken by an injury.
